

Euclidis Opera Omnia VOL 1

CHANGES MADE TO GOOGLE SCANS

Google has currently has two copies of this volume available for download. In one copy, from about page 250 to the end, most right hand pages (containing Heiberg's Latin translation) are missing about .25 in of text from the *left* hand side. The other copy contains right hand pages that have illegible text in the lower *right* hand side. One volume is missing page 289.

Using Photoshop, I "grafted" the lower right hand side of the pages missing .25 in of text on the left hand side onto the pages with the illegible lower right hand side. Confused yet? :) The result is that all pages (except 289) are - as far as I can tell - perfectly legible.

I inserted a scan of page 289 from a library copy of volume 1.

I have not made any changes to this volume, as it seems to have been satisfactorily scanned (i.e., all pages are included in order, with no illegible portions as far as I can tell). It seems to bear the mark of the Stanford University Library.

If you notice any imperfections with the scans I have posted, please bring them to my attention, and I will to my best to correct them. These texts must be preserved, and be preserved intact. Most copies of the Teubner series from this period (the late 1800's) are brittle to the touch, and neither

Teubner nor anyone else seems interested in reprinting them. These works are among the greatest achievements of the human mind and of Western Civilization, though many are in debt to the great Babylonian astronomers and mathematicians, who wrote in the Semitic language, Akkadian.
